

Q&A: Ann Todd, PT, MOMT

What is outpatient physical therapy?

Physical therapy is used to treat musculoskeletal injuries. Treatment involves diagnosing the specific injury, applying appropriate stimuli to heal the tissue, and to get the patient back to their previous level of activity.

Are physical therapists qualified to diagnose injuries?

Yes, in fact, physical therapists have some of the highest scores in the health care industry when tested on the ability to diagnose musculoskeletal injuries, second only to orthopedic surgeons.

Do I need a doctor's referral to get rehabilitation?

No, you do not need a referral. Just give us a call.

Is physical therapy expensive?

Interestingly, compared to other forms of treatment, physical therapy is one of the cheapest methods for treating injuries. A 2012 study in the journal *Spine* showed that patients diagnosed with low back pain who were referred to PT within the first two weeks of injury had a reduction in overall health care costs of \$1,200 to \$2,200, with the same or better outcomes. Furthermore, they were 53 percent less likely to need surgery, 52 percent less likely to need an epidural injection, and 46 percent less likely to need an MRI.
